<p><b>Briefly list strategies completed.</b></p> <p>1. Data will be gathered for number of children in area schools who received dental screenings during 2004-05 school year. During the 2004-05 school year, dental screenings were provided at 6 school districts. 1632 school children were screened.</p> <p>2. Data will be gathered from dentists in Cape County and Scott City for # of children receiving sealant applications during 2004-05 school year, as well as from school-based dental sealant program. We surveyed 30 local dentists who applied 2138 dental sealants during the 2004-05 school year: During the 2004-05 school year Cape &amp; Jackson school districts participated in the school based dental sealant program. 310 sealants were placed on 62 children through the school-based program.</p> <p>3. If possible, data will be gathered from school nurses on # of children receiving indicated treatment for 2004-05 school year. Of the 1632 children screened during 2004-05 school year, 180 were referred for treatment with reports that 24 children received indicated treatment.</p> <p>4. Identify and engage at least 5 community stakeholders to form a "local dental health care coalition". At this time we have the dental community represented, the county health department, head start and DMS involved. I am trying to solicit a couple of influential business persons to join the coalition.</p>	
<p><b>List other accomplishments toward plan progress.</b></p> <p>1. Some modifications to the original plan, making it more functional and realistic.</p> <p>2. The state oral health program is interested in the work of the local coalition, and would like to use it as a pilot project for other areas of the state.</p> <p>3.</p> <p>4.</p>	
<p><b>List concerns/barriers to progress.</b></p> <p>The ability to continue to rely on the dental community to volunteer for the screenings. Also, with the school day so busy, continuing to provide the services during the school day.</p>
